



National Statics of Homeless Veterans

- **National Statistics**
 - **Total veteran population 22,658,000 (per the U.S. Dept. of Veterans Affairs)**
 - **23% of the homeless population are veterans**
 - **47% are from the Vietnam Era**
 - **67% have served 3-7 years**
 - **89% have received an Honorable Discharge**

- A long term, residential, transitional, housing center for male veterans that are 18 years or older, homeless, alcohol or chemically addicted or struggle with P.T.S.D. has been established on the southeast side of Winchester.
- The Journey Home serves veterans in Delaware, Henry, Jay, Randolph and Wayne Counties in Indiana and Darke, Mercer and Preble Counties in Ohio.

Veterans

- Veterans make a six month personal commitment to the recovery program.
- Residents will attend daily recovery sessions and have access to spiritual counselors and a caring staff
- They are held accountable for their behavior as well as for the completion of daily work assignments.
- Dignity and a healthy self-image are viewed as basic tools to recovery.
