# Background and Setting

- Purdue University
  - West Lafayette, IN
  - 39,256 enrolled students (fall 2012)
    - o 57% Male
    - 43% Female
  - Student veteran population (fall 2012)
    - Over 400 enrolled
    - Another 300+ family members
- Purdue Student Veteran Organization Origins
  - 2007 Four students, prior US Army Airborne soldiers, form a social group (un-official to Purdue).
  - Non-Airborne student veterans express interest in joining
  - 2009 Purdue Student Veteran Organization is formed (official to Purdue)
  - 2010 to 2012 Large increases in membership




## Mission and Objectives

  - Serve as a social organization for veterans


- Survey
  - 31 member responses




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## Strategy and Implementation

# Strategy and Implementation

- Purdue Partnerships
  - Purdue Student Government (PSG)
    - Proposed legislation for Class Excusal Policy
  - Student Veteran's Advisory Council
    - Reviews student veteran issues and provides solution oriented pathways
  - Public Relations Course
    - Learn more effective techniques for reaching other student veterans

#### Accomplishments

- Membership growing annually as well as campus support and recognition
- Veteran's Day ceremony
  - Co-hosted with PSUB for past 3 Years
- Student Veteran Learning Community
- Student Veteran Mentorship Program
- Recent veteran coordinator hire

#### Accomplishments

- Grand Prix
  - All veteran team, 2011 & 2012
  - Returning in 2013
  - Local American Legion donated \$2K
- Community involvement
  - Raised monies from SVO membership to help local veterans in need
  - Supported Lafayette Homeless Veterans Stand-down

### Accomplishments

- National Charity Support
  - Operation Bedding
    - Ran game ball from Bloomington to Lafayette in 2010 for "Old Oaken Bucket" football game
    - Raised nearly \$4000!
  - Wounded Warrior Project
    - Purdue SVO, Lafayette Ivy-Tech SVO 1<sup>st</sup> Annual 2012 Golf Scramble
      - 20 sponsors and 80 golfers
      - Raised nearly \$2500!

#### Lessons Learned

- Communication is vital
  - With membership
  - With Purdue leadership
  - Keep SVO website updated/current
- Building rapport with Purdue staff and students
  - Veteran Advisory Council
  - PSG
  - Public Relations class
  - Provides leverage and synergy!

#### Lessons Learned

- Soliciting \$'s is not easy
  - Contacted 80 local businesses
  - Supply cost of \$135 and 10 man-hours preparation; few replies
  - But...Shell Inc. support proves it can be done!
- Student Veteran Learning Community
  - One registered student (fall 2012)
  - Progress may be slow…but don't give up!

## Sustainability

- Growing Membership, Leadership, Raising Funds
  - Actively recruit new members
    - Mentor highly involved members into leadership
    - Span multiple graduation years
    - If possible, ensure each service is represented
  - Form relationships with companies
    - International and local
      - Shell Corp., Cummins Inc., Enterprise, GE
      - Employment info/funding potential

## Sustainability

- Cooperation with organizations outside of Purdue
  - Lafayette area Ivy-Tech SVO
  - Local veteran groups such as the American Legion
    - Continue to support and aide other organizations
    - Continue to grow relationships
